#### WARREN CITY COUNCIL PUBLIC HEARING AND REGULAR MEETING MAY 20, 2024 – 7:00 PM

#### PUBLIC HEARING

Vice-President Flasher opened the public hearing. Mr. Rossey stated that during its April 15 regular meeting, Council voted to adopt the proposed Zoning Ordinance with §470-54 Short-Term Rentals deleted in its entirety. \*

The City Solicitor deemed the removal of §470-54 Short-Term Rentals to be a substantive change to the ordinance and, therefore, it was referred back to the Planning Commission for its review and recommendation. In addition, Council directed the Planning Commission to review the Mixed-Use District under the ordinance with Mrs. McCain to present her concerns for the Commission's consideration.

The Planning Commission met on April 17 with five of the six seated members in attendance. The members present voted unanimously to support removal of §470-54 Short-Term Rentals from the ordinance. The members present also voted unanimously to recommend that there be no changes made to the Mixed-Use District regulations.

\*Following removal of Short-Term Rentals, §470-54 was retitled and all subsequent sections were renumbered.

There being no citizens wishing to provide comment, Vice-President Flasher closed the public hearing.

### **OPENING OF MEETING**

Council Vice-President Danielle Flasher presided over the May 20, 2024, regular meeting of Warren City Council in Council Chambers of the Municipal Building and opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

- Kevin Sheldon requested that the City provide advance notice of special events to business/property owners in/adjacent to the event area so that they may prepare accordingly.
- David Winans spoke in opposition to the Hudson Companies' Eagles Crest Project and suggested that the City hire an independent consultant to conduct a review of the project and its viability.
- Ron Peterson questioned whether an asbestos study has been completed for the Eagle's Crest Project. Mr. Rossey responded that the Department of Environmental Protection guidelines regarding asbestos abatement and the issuance of demolition permits are being followed.

#### APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Upon motion by Mr. Cashman and second by Mr. Barbera, Council members voted unanimously to approve the agenda as presented.

Mr. Cashman made a motion not to amend the agenda. The motion was seconded by Mr. Gilbert and carried unanimously.

### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Upon motion by Mr. Cashman and second by Mr. Gilbert, the minutes of the April 15, 2024, regular meeting were unanimously approved as presented.

#### CORRESPONDENCE

### ORDINANCE NO. 1978: ZONING

Mr. Cashman made the motion to approve the ordinance adopting and incorporating the Zoning Ordinance as amended at the April 15, 2024, Council meeting. The motion was seconded by Mr. Gilbert and carried with six votes in the affirmative and one nay vote cast by Mrs. McCain.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 3257: GEOTHERMAL ENERGY MINOR SUBDIVISION**

Mr. Rossey stated that the City of Warren filed a minor subdivision application to subdivide the property located at Clark Street (Parcel No. WN-579-124) and currently owned by Geothermal Energy System, LLC. The minor subdivision would divide the existing Geothermal Energy System, LLC, property into two lots with Geothermal Energy System, LLC retaining Lot 1 and Lot 2 being conveyed to the City of Warren.

During its regular meeting on April 18, 2024, the City Planning Commission reviewed the application and voted to recommend that it be approved by City Council. The Warren County Planning and Zoning Commission reviewed the subdivision on April 19, 2024, and also recommended Council's approval.

Mr. Cashman made the motion to adopt the resolution approving the Geothermal Energy Minor Subdivision. The motion was seconded by Mr. Gilbert and carried with six votes in the affirmative and one nay vote cast by Mrs. McCain.

### **RESOLUTION NO. 3258: THE LANDING EAST MINOR SUBDIVISION**

Mr. Rossey stated that the City of Warren filed a minor subdivision application to subdivide the property located at 321-339 Breeze Point Circle (Parcel No. WN-575-9922) currently owned by The Landing at Warren, LP. The minor subdivision would divide the existing The Landing at Warren, LP property into two lots with The Landing at Warren, LP retaining Lot 1 and Lot 2 being conveyed to the City of Warren.

During its regular meeting on April 18, 2024, the City Planning Commission reviewed the application and voted to recommend that it be approved by City Council. The Warren County Planning and Zoning Commission reviewed the subdivision on April 19, 2024, and also recommended Council's approval.

Mr. Cashman made the motion to adopt the resolution approving The Landing East Minor Subdivision. The motion was seconded by Mr. Gilbert and carried with six votes in the affirmative and one nay vote cast by Mrs. McCain.

## AGREEMENT: BROKENSTRAW TOWNSHIP EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

Chief Krogler stated that the Brokenstraw Township Supervisors have agreed to and signed an agreement for the provision of EMS by the City Fire Department as a backup to their primary providers which are EmergyCare, Inc. and the Youngsville Volunteer Fire Department. An agreement with language and terms matching the agreements with other members of the Multi-Municipal Emergency Services Commission has been drafted. Chief Krogler noted that such agreements help to ensure EMS coverage for citizens in need outside of the City, while ensuring the City Fire Department is more appropriately compensated when responding to those EMS calls outside of the City.

Mr. Cashman made the motion to approve the Brokenstraw Township Emergency Medical Service agreement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Gilbert and carried unanimously.

## LEASE AGREEMENT: J & D ADVENTURES, LLC

Mr. Holtz stated that the City and J & D Adventures, LLC, entered into a Quit Claim Assignment of Oil and Gas Lease and Bill of Sale dated July 17, 2023 and pertaining to City-owned properties known as the Public Works (DPW) Garage and the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

J & D Adventures proposes activities to expand production at the existing sites and, therefore, it was requested that the City enter into an Oil and Gas Lease for the premises without the limitations set forth in the 2023 Quit Claim Assignment of Oil and Gas Lease and Bill of Sale.

Mr. Cashman made the motion to approve the agreement with J & D Adventures, LLC. The motion was seconded by Mr. Gilbert and carried unanimously.

### LETTER OF CONFIRMATION: TWIG & VINE OUTDOOR ALCOHOL SERVICE

Mr. Holtz stated that Ordinance No. 1956, dated April 19, 2021, provides that, in the C-1 Central Commercial District, business owners may place tables and/or chairs purchased at their expense, and approved by City staff, directly in front of their place of business for the purpose of serving their patrons and such seating may be reserved for the sole use of the business' patrons. The City-owned outdoor seating is provided for use by the public at large and may not be reserved for use by any individual or business.

Wendy McCain, owner of twig & vine, submitted a letter in which she states her intent to submit an application to the PA Liquor Control Board (PLCB) for a temporary permit to extend the service of alcohol to the area directly in front of the currently licensed premises; the permit would be in effect until December 31, 2024. The PLCB requires that a letter of permission from the City be included in the application package.

Mr. Cashman made the motion to authorize submission of the Letter of Confirmation to the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board. The motion was seconded by Mr. Barbera and carried with six votes in the affirmative and one abstention by Mrs. McCain. (See attached statement re purpose for abstention.)

## MAYOR'S APPOINTMENT: JUNIOR COUNCIL MEMBER SELECTION COMMITTEE

Vice-President Flasher read a memorandum from Mayor Wortman advising Council of his appointment of Miss Flasher, Mr. Cashman, and Mr. Villella to the Junior Council Member Selection Committee.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS

Marketing Committee: There were no activities to report for the prior month.

<u>Council of Governments (COG)</u>: Miss Flasher provided an overview of the May 1 meeting and reported that Student Government Day was a success.

**<u>Riverfront Development</u>:** Mr. Yurisic presented an overview of the Breezepoint River Access Public Comment and Response Document. He also reviewed project-related activities from January 1, 2024, through May 10, 2024.

<u>Warren Worx</u>: The minutes of the recent Executive Committee meeting were distributed to Council members. Miss Flasher stated that the Marketing Director position is being advertised.

**Comprehensive Plan Task Force:** Mr. Rossey reported that representatives of Dudley Sign Systems toured the City with Task Force Members and City Staff. Potential sign locations were identified and an estimate of costs will be prepared.

Mr. Rossey reported that over two hundred responses to the Mulberry Park Survey were received with most respondents being in favor of maintaining a park. The responses will be reviewed by Task Force members and forwarded to the Parks Recreation & Landscape Commission.
