A total of 2,667 surveys were completed in April 2023. Of those 2,354 were included in analysis. Excluded surveys include those not in the attendance area (47), those who did not indicate attendance area (21), those who only answered the first question (245) (which accounted for several of the duplicate IP addresses).

Key Findings

The following are key findings from the survey:

- Parents provide higher ratings of the current school configuration than staff, business owners, community members and especially teachers. Teachers (especially those in grades 9-12) rated the current configuration lower than any other group. Those in Attendance Area 4 (Warren) also rated the current configuration lower than any other group.
- Teachers more than any other group tend to agree that Option 1 (Sheffield 9-12 moves to Warren) and Option 2 (Youngsville 9-12 moves to Warren and Eisenhower) meets the various criteria.
- Grade 9-12 teachers tend to agree that Option 1 (Sheffield 9-12 moves to Warren) and Option 2 (Youngsville 9-12 moves to Warren and Eisenhower) meet most of the criteria.
- Parents more than any other group tend to agree that Option 3 (create a K-12 Youngsville) and Option 5 (no change to current configuration) meet most of the criteria.
- Grade 9-12 Parents tend to agree that Option 3 (create a K-12 in Youngsville) meets most of the criteria.
- Municipal officials and students tend to agree that Option 3 (create a K-12 in Youngsville) meets most of the criteria.
- Different groups (teachers, business owners and municipal officials) tend to agree that Option 4 (Eisenhower 9-12 moves to Youngsville and Warren) meets some criteria better than others.
- Youngsville Attendance Area residents tend to agree that Option 3 (create a K-12 Youngsville) and Option 6 (adjust the attendance boundaries) meet all of the criteria.
- Sheffield Attendance Area residents tend to agree that Option 5 (keep all 4 high schools open) meets all
 of the criteria.
- Although not listed as an option several respondents wrote in that there should be 2 high schools (either East and West or North and South)

In summary:

- Option 1 (Sheffield 9-12 moves to Warren) is the preferred option for Teachers (especially 9-12 teachers), staff, community members, as well as Eisenhower and Warren Attendance area residents.
- Option 5 (no change) is the preferred option overall and for parents (especially 9-12 parents), business
 owners, municipal officials, as well as Sheffield and Youngsville Attendance area residents.
