Course Description: This course is designed to provide students with the background needed to help perform their economic roles more intelligently as they become consumers, producers, and decision makers. This course emphasizes the role of free markets in determining economic well-being. Students will learn the fundamentals of microeconomics including supply, demand, and pricing, along with the basics of macroeconomics: Monetary Policy, Fiscal Policy, Money, Supply, and the role of government in stabilizing and growing the economy. The organization and instruction of the course is geared toward those students looking to pursue postsecondary education and for those who are interested in a more comprehensive study of Economics thus the College Preparatory (CP) Economics differs from Economics in that students will do more supplemental readings (especially primary source documents) as well as more writing assignments and research. District marking period assessments are required.
