#### America250PA Project Assembly – March 20th, 2025



Pi Day (Week) – Mrs. Blasco and Mrs. Haslett's classes had a great time exploring the mathematical marvel of PI, the ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter. They learned: It's a decimal representation that goes on infinitely without repeating. If you take any circle and divide its circumference (the distance around it) by its diameter (the distance across it), you will always get pi. Pi is approximately equal to 3.14159, but its decimal representation continues infinitely. Pi is fundamental in many areas of mathematics, physics, and engineering. It's used in calculations involving circles, spheres and other geometric shapes.

Mr. Norris's math enrichment groups recently completed a Pick-A-Project, a challenge that encouraged students to apply mathematical concepts to real-world applications. Beyond their understanding of fractions, students utilized critical thinking, STEM, and language arts skills to plan, design, and develop innovative mathematical solutions.
