FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. What exactly is the School Nutrition Incentive Program?

For schools that agree to implement the Pennsylvania Department of Education's (PDE) revised Nutrition Standards for Competitive Foods in Pennsylvania Schools, the Governor's 2007-08 investment will provide higher reimbursement rates for every breakfast and lunch served through the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs.

2. What additional reimbursements can schools expect to earn in School Year 2007-08 if they adopt and implement, at a minimum, the *Nutrition Standards* for Competitive Foods in Pennsylvania Schools, and how do these reimbursement rates compare with the current state reimbursement rates?
