- 2. Exploring and understanding factors that impact the decision to become a parent. 15-20 days
- 3. Exploring and understanding various parenting styles, parental responsibilities, and common parenting problems. 15-20 days
- 4. Understanding communication skills and how they affect relationships in the family. 15-20 days
- 5. Family stresses and crisis and how they impact the lives of children 15-20 days
