COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The emphasis in art experiences will be to acquaint the student with the relationships that exist between art styles, media and techniques. Students will explore through research and replication the historical, geographical and cultural diversity found in the visual arts.

Outline of Content Sequence and Recommended Time:

It is recommended that the course take on a research/product/discussion sequence. In some instances research will be in written form and in others presented orally.

- Week 1-2 Reconstruct a 3-deminsional form based on an assigned culture. Student will research traditions of culture, explore traditional media and create product.
- Week 3- 4 Further research into particular culture, documentation and presentation of changes or adaptations made as a result of changes in climate or sociological influences.
- Week 5-6 Discussion of modern culture and visual documentation using technology. Identify various venues for artistic expression and document the artist experience.
- Week 7-8 Research and analysis of an assigned historical period and/or culture.
- Week 9- 10 Research/discuss and respond to architectural differences associated with culture, geographic region and historical period.
- **Week 11-12** Discussion of the affect that geography may play on cultures and traditions.

- Week 13-14 Using traditional media and techniques to simulate a work of art native to assigned region or culture,
- Week 15-16 Critical response to simulated work
- Week 17-18 Student will create an original work that reflects their unique artistic experienced and defend it in relationship to their geographical region and culture.
