Norbert,

I have been working with the art teachers and students at YHS to initiate a mural painting project in the halls at YHS for this spring. The murals would be used to identify the general purpose of each hallway – i.e. a mural of test tubes, beakers, microscope, etc. for the science wing, or a quill and ink, parchment paper and maybe Ben Franklin or something for the social studies wing. No designs have been perfected as of yet. Also, the students are interested in painting a red eagle in the vestibule lobby area right inside the front doors.

The murals, with the exception of the eagle, would be painted on MDF board and then cut out by the shop class and mounted in the hallways over the lockers. This technique would allow the murals to be taken down in the event the halls would need to be painted, and then reinstalled.

I assume a project of this scope would need board approval. May this be placed on the agenda for the next committee meeting? I will prepare a project request in writing for you and submit photos of the areas involved, sample drawings, etc. Would it be permissible for the maintenance people at YHS to install the murals once they are finished?

Art 1,2,3 and 4 students would work together to complete the project under the direction of art teachers Randy Swanson and Brian Toy. The project will be part of the students' curriculum. (Service-learning at its best!) YVC will pay for all materials needed.
