Payment in full must be received on or before May 16, 2006 in order to participate in the SU06 offering of EDTEC 400. This deadline will enable Student Services ample time to process your registration.

An information technology fee has been added to all World Campus credit and noncredit courses. This fee supports the development and maintenance of the technology infrastructure of the University.
