TUESDAY 13 MARCH

Departures from Charlotte as per Flight Information List.

We will fly Transatlantic on Aer Lingus to Shannon Airport on west coast of Ireland. Dinner will be served on board, with an in flight movie shown afterwards. After the movie it is a good idea to get some rest so that we are fit, well, and ready to enjoy ourselves during the upcoming days.

- We must have our Passports available for Inspection; after check in please keep your Passport in a safe place.
- Small instruments such as **CLARINETS**, **FLUTES**, **PICCOLOS** etc., must be carried in peoples' suitcases. All other instruments must be checked to **Shannon**.
- We must not make jokes about security issues Security personnel take them very seriously.

WEDNESDAY 14 MARCH - Arrive Shannon Airport and transfer to Galway.

Arrive in Shannon Airport in the early morning as per flight schedule.

Our checked instruments will be placed on an AGT truck for transfer to Galway.

All persons must claim their bags from the appropriate Baggage Carousel and then proceed through Customs. Customs channels are Green and Red – Green is Nothing to Declare, Red is Goods to Declare. Our Irish Driver/Guides, who will escort us to our coaches, will meet us in the main Arrivals Hall, outside the Customs Hall.

As we board our luxury European-touring coaches, **Irish Pipers** will pipe the traditional **"Failte Padraidgh - St. Patrick's Welcome"** to our group. Our coaches will transfer us to Galway, for check in to **Davs Hotel**.

En route to Galway we will visit Bunratty Castle and Folk Park.

Bunratty Folk Park includes within its environs Bunratty Castle, a 13th century castle, which was the stronghold and family castle of the O'Brien Clan. William Penn, the founder of Pennsylvania, lived here for some time as a baby. The castle grounds contain an exact replica of a 19th century Irish Village Street, complete with shops and houses from the Shannon region covering a period of 200 years.

Dinner followed by Irish entertainment at the Westwood hotel.

Overnight at Days Hotel, Galway.

Breakfast at Irish Hotels usually consists of Fruit Juices and Cereals (Same as USA), followed by Bacon, Eggs and Sausage with Tea\Coffee and Toast and Brown (Soda) Bread.

Dinner at Irish Hotels usually consists of a starter of salad or soup, Main course of Beef, Lamb, Pork, Hamburgers or Chicken, all served with vegetables, followed by Dessert and Tea\Coffee. Milk and Soft drinks are charged extra. Menu changes daily.

Galway is on the west coast of Ireland, the capital of Gaelic Ireland, on the eastern shore of Galway Bay and 5,000 miles northeast of Denver. University College Galway conferred an Honorary Degree on President Regan when he visited Galway in 1984, to honor the 500th anniversary of the chartering of Galway as a City. Galway is a wonderful city to stroll around. Visit bookshops, boutiques, and coffee shops, all will please and make you feel welcome. Galway is a very cosmopolitan city; during the middle ages Galway had already established trade and cultural links with France, Spain and Portugal.

THURSDAY 15 MARCH

8.00A Breakfast at hotel followed by 9.00A tour of Connamara, the area west of Galway.

Connamara (Beside the Sea in Irish) is an area of 1,500 square miles west of the City of Galway. It is an area of lakes, mountains, rivers and wonderful land and seascapes.

We will travel through Moycullen, Oughterard, Maam Cross through Leenane and Killary Harbour to Cilfden which is the main town in Connamara.

In Moycullen we will visit Celtic Crystal.

In Kylemore we will visit Kylemore Abbey.

In Clifden we will stop for a couple of hours and then return to Galway by 5.00P.

6.30P Dinner at hotel.

8.00P Concert Festival in the Church of **St. Nicholas,** where it is believed Christopher Columbus used to attend **Mass** on his visits to Galway.

The concert will include performances by St. Patrick's School Brass Band, Galway and Valley High School, Des Moines, Iowa.

Overnight at Days Hotel, Galway.

FRIDAY 16 MARCH

7.30A Breakfast at hotel followed by checkout and 9.00A departure for Dublin.

DUBLIN is Ireland's capital city is located on the east coast of Ireland and has a population of 1.1m people.

In 1988 Dublin celebrated the one-thousandth anniversary of its charter as a city. Originally founded by the Vikings, Dublin in the 19th century was second only to London as a center of culture and fashion. Today, as a modern European capital, it is a bustling, vibrant and exciting city particularly in its stores, cafes and coffee shops.

We will travel across central Ireland through the towns of Ballinasloe, Athlone and Kinnegad.

Arrive in Dublin around midday and enjoy a Panoramic tour of Dublin prior to checking in to the CityWest Hotel.

SATURDAY 17 MARCH - LA FEILE PHADRAIGH - ST. PATRICK'S DAY

7.30 – 8.30A Breakfast at the hotel, followed by 9.30A transfer to the assembly area for the St. Patrick's Day Parade.

At 12.00N THE LORD MAYOR OF DUBLIN'S 2007 ST. PATRICK'S DAY PARADE moves off from Parnell Square through O'Connell Street, the General Post Office and the heart of the ancient city of Dublin, passing Trinity College, the old Parliament buildings, Christ Church Cathedral, St. Patrick's Cathedral and on to Parade dispersal in Kevin Street.

The Parade will have Bands and Floats from all over the world, all joining in the fun and festivities. It will take about two hours to pass the Review Stands. The Parade is extremely well supported by the citizens of **Dublin**; about 500,000 people usually attend. The Parade will be completed by approximately 2P.

Following the Parade our coaches will await us and transfer us to our hotel.

This evening we will attend the St. Patrick's Night Dance for visiting Bands.

Dinner and Overnight at the CityWest Hotel, Saggart, Dublin.

SUNDAY 18 MARCH

8.30A Breakfast at hotel followed by **9.00A** City Tour of Dublin. During the Tour we will visit Phoenix Park where Pope John Paul celebrated Mass for over 1 million people on his visit to Ireland. **Trinity College** and **St. Michan's Church.**

Trinity College

The oldest University in Ireland, it was founded in 1592 by Elizabeth 1st. Within its walls, you will be able to admire Parliament Square and its 18th Century edifices. The visit of the Old Library, containing over twenty thousand manuscripts, is often surprising by its splendor. The ninth Century **Book of Kells**, famous for its precious illuminations, is exhibited in the library.

St. Michans Church was founded in the 12th century. The church is one of the oldest in Ireland and has a number of interesting features. The church organ was the organ used by Handel when practicing and preparing for the premiere of "The Messiah". The crypt has unusual properties that result in the non-decay of bodies buried there; one may view the naturally mummified remains of a Mediaeval Knight Crusader.

Afternoon free in Dublin for shopping and exploration.

MONDAY 19 MARCH

8.00A Breakfast at hotel followed by 9.00A departure on tour to Kilkenny.
