20	used in the instructional program shall be available for inspection by the						
21	parents/guardians. Instructional materials shall not include tests or academic						
22	assessments.

24	Surveys/Evaluations						
25							
26	All surveys and instruments used to collect information from students shall relate to the						
27	District's educational objectives. Surveys conducted by outside agencies, organizations						
28	and individuals shall be approved by the Superintendent prior to administration to						
29	students.						
30 31	Parents/guardians shall be informed of the nature and scope of individual surveys and						
32	their relationship to the educational program of their child and parents'/guardians' right						
33	to inspect, upon request, a survey created by a third party prior to administration or						
34	distribution to a student. Such requests shall be in writing and submitted to the building						
35	Principal.

37	No student shall be required to submit to a survey, analysis, or evaluation that reveals						
38	information concerning:

40	1. Political affiliations or beliefs of a student or the student's parents/guardians.

44	3. Sexual behavior or attitudes.
