Course Title Music – Grade 6

## **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Music 6 includes signing using the Kodaly Method, note reading using Orff Techniques, activities encompassing the scope of music elements (dynamics, tone color, tempo, pitch, texture, form style), and vocal technique and productions. There is no final exam.
