17	member. A copy of the evaluation form is attached.

21	* Be candid, open, and constructive. A Superintendent cannot function effectively					
22	without periodic feedback about his/her performance. It is essential for growth.

24	* Bear in mind that all of us approach our jobs somewhat differently, and often an					
25	administrator doesn't handle the problem/issue/assignment exactly as another person					
26	might, but the bottom-line is: Is the Superintendent operating as a sound and competent					
27	Chief School Officer. Is the Superintendent an effective leader, administrator, and					
28	manager?
