Course Title: <u>Contemporary Global Issues</u>

This course is designed to explore the dynamics of contemporary global issues/interactions among nations and regions. This course investigates a variety of global issues, historical context, multiple perspectives of those involved, and the current political, economic, and social implications. Students will confront alternative points of view on a broad spectrum of issues, be encouraged to debate these issues, form their own opinions regarding possible solutions to each issue, and investigate why each issue is an ongoing problem. Students taking this course must keep up with current events through the use of magazines, newscasts, radio news, newspapers, and the Internet. Likely topics include, but are not limited to: Terrorism, geopolitics, first world versus developing nations, globalization, and human rights.
