COURSE DESCRIPTION

Course Title: Forensic Psychology

Course Number: 00185

Course Prerequisites: Grade of at least 70% in Psychology I

Forensic Psychology is the application of the science and profession of psychology to questions and issues relating to law and the criminal and civil justice systems. This course applies psychological theories, principles, and research to issues of concern to the criminal justice system. This course is concerned with the prevention, detection, and reduction of crime. Throughout the course, students will acquire knowledge and practice in the application of psychological methods to understanding criminal behavior. They will use critical thinking and research skills to examine problems and issues related to criminal behavior. Students will look at the motives behind criminal acts such as persistent violence, multiple murders, and sexual offenses. This course is designed to increase students' knowledge and understanding of the interaction of law and the study and practice of psychology, to show students how their knowledge of psychology and the law can be applied to their daily lives and experiences and their understanding of themselves and others. This course will also help students develop critical thinking skills as well as improve their reading, writing and presentation skills. A final exam is required.
