4.2 Budget Discussion

- The Budget Timeline was presented by Mr. Jim Grosch.
- The Governor's proposed revenue budget was reviewed for Basic Education and Special Education funds as well as cost reductions for Cyber/Charter program.
- Mr. Grosch attended a Budget presentation held by PASBO on March 19th and paraphrased some of the comments from the event.

They believe the Governor's budget is a very ambitions budget. He talked about the need for a new BEF formula. He wants to help schools meet mandatory cost for special education services, provide the school property tax relief, implement a new cyber charter school tuition rate. How is he going to accomplish that? There are two new tax increases that he is talking about and one new tax. The tax increases will be a state personal income tax increase from 3% to 3.7%. The state sales tax increase will be from 6% to 6.6% plus expand on what's taxable. The new tax is what's called a gas service tax and this tax would be used to fund or help fund basic and special education, vocational programs and extensive expansion of Pre-K programs. All of this being said; it's a total influx, if it goes through, of \$400 million dollars.

There is a lot of discussion between legislation.

- Two letters were discussed; one from Pedro Rivera, Acting Secretary of Education and the other was from Majority Leader, Dave Reed.
- Referendum exceptions were approved by PDE for special education; \$246,852.00 and retirement; \$488,201.00.
- List of additional cuts to look at and continue to evaluate for further information.
- Between now and the meeting on the 13th the Board should decide if they want a work session on the 20th or if they want one on the 27th.
 At April regular board meeting board will decide if they will have a discussion on the 20th or 27th.

4.3 Pending SMART Board Purchase

- Title funding would like to purchase SMART Boards.

4.4 Budget Transfer/Adjustment

- This is for the 21st Century Program.
 - The state gave us the 15-16 school year information. We are still waiting for the 14-15 information.
