- 4.1 Secondary Class Size Update 2017-2018. Listing of core course and elective is on BoardDocs. Paul Mangione asked how this fits in with high school reform and will there be any changes? Eric Mineweaser explained that if all goes accordingly, and we go to a 7 period day, courses would be reduced, which may not be a bad thing because then our class size can get larger and teacher prep will go down. Paul said that so far we've learned that with the higher level classes, students like to see an alternating schedule. Eric said we are going to look at balancing those out.

Kim Yourchisin – Principal of Grades 9-12

- Had a Board tour a couple of weeks ago and Kim added some handouts to the Board tour packet
- They have more students enrolled this year than last year
- SPP score is up this year

- Huge number of students utilizing the free & reduced lunch program
- Abraxas is planning to co-op for football
- Can offer a course for college credit
- Twenty-one students use food pantry to grocery shop every week
- Middle level student government is opening a clothing closet
- PBS featured two SAMHS staff in an "Our Town" presentation
- She is hoping that high school reform will help align middle level schedules with high school schedules
- Improvement plan for this year
- Review of testing scores and numbers
- Plan for this year to prepare students for a career of their interest
- Provide students with a safe and secure learning environment

Sheffield Area Elementary School – Marcia Madigan (Grade K-5 & middle level)

- At the middle level they are working on discipline, motivation and bring-your-own device to school; trying to get students engaged in community programs
- Trying to motivate and include students in the school climate; hoping that it will help alleviate some of the discipline problems
- Goal for Title I this year SAES (K-5) is Title I; services available for all students; several parents worked on a student compact for Title I
- School has fresh fruit and vegetable program on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday students are introduced to a new fruit and vegetable; students get to try new things; program is free
- Trying to meet the needs of each child, based on data and teacher input; use tutors, Title I staff, Special Education staff
- Excellent teachers, tutors and aides
- One of Marcia's goals this year is communication; teacher do newsletters weekly and they get sent home
- BMX bicycle assembly at SAES on October 24, 2017

5. Other

5.1 Building Buddies Program at WAEC – Megan Leach and students

Megan read comments from parents and students regarding the buddy program. The program was developed by Megan watching her own daughter develop a friendship with her students. She focused on 3rd and 4th grade. Megan hoped to get a small amount first, but several students were interested and there was an application process. The idea is to pair students from general education with students from special needs. Fifty students are now buddied with 3rd and 4th grades and also with additional programs throughout the school. Part of the application is a buddy behavior pledge. Students eat lunch and attend recess together; the expectation is one day per week, but students are coming more often. Megan would like to grow this program at semesters with grades K-2. A parent told her that she is changing lives with this program. Megan said she doesn't think she is changing lives, but she is certain that the students are changing each other's lives!
