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12 13		The educational program offered by the District is predicated upon the presence of the student in school. In order for students to benefit from planned educational
14		activities and classroom participation, it is essential that regular attendance be
15 16		maintained.
10 17		Definitions
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19		"School age" shall be defined as the period from the earliest admission age for the
20		District's kindergarten program until graduation from high school or the end of the
21 22		school term in which a student reaches the age of twenty-one (21) years, whichever occurs first.

24		"District of residence" shall be defined as the school district in which a student's
25		parents/guardians reside.

27 28		"Compulsory school age," shall be defined as the period of a child's life from the time the shild entern school, which shall be not later than at the age of eight (8) years, until
28 29		the child enters school, which shall be not later than at the age of eight (8) years, until the age of seventeen (17) years. The term shall not include any child who holds a
30		certificate of graduation from a regularly accredited, licensed , registered , or
31		approved senior high school.
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33		Right to Attend Public School
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35 36		The District shall enroll school age students eligible to attend District schools, in
30 37		accordance with applicable laws and regulations, Board policy and administrative regulations.
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39		For purposes of the above definition of "school age," in order to meet the earliest
40		admission age for the District's kindergarten program, the student must be five-years-
41		old before the first day of school of the school year in which admission is sought.
42		Beginning with the 2020/2021 school year, and continuing thereafter, in order to meet
43		the earliest admission age for the District's kindergarten program, the student must be

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five-years-old on or before July 1. No early admission to Kindergarten shall be 1 2 permitted. 3 4 In order to be eligible for first grade as a beginner, the student must be six-years-old 5 before the first day of school of the school year in which admission is sought. 6 Beginning with the 2021/2022 school year, and continuing thereafter, in order to be 7 eligible for first grade as a beginner, the student must be six-years-old on or before 8 July 1. No early admission to first grade as a beginner shall be permitted. 9 10 **Enrollment Requirements** 11 12 School age resident students and eligible nonresident students shall be entitled to 13 attend District schools. 14 15 The District shall not enroll a student until the parent/guardian has submitted proof of 16 the student's age, residence, and immunizations and a completed Parent Registration 17 Statement, as required by the applicable law and regulations. 18 19 The District shall administer a home language survey to all students enrolling in 20 District schools for the first time. 21 22 The District shall normally enroll a school age, eligible student the next business day, 23 but no later than five (5) business days after application. 24 25 The District shall not inquire about the immigration status of a student as part of the 26 enrollment process, nor shall any child's right to be admitted to school be conditioned 27 on the child's immigration status. 28 29 Enrollment requirements and administrative regulations shall apply to nonresident 30 students approved to attend District schools, in accordance with Board policy, by the Superintendent. 31 32 33 **Residency Eligibility** 34 35 When the parents of a student reside in different school districts, the student may 36 attend school in the district of residence of the parent with whom the student lives for 37 the majority of the time, unless a court order or court approved custody agreement 38 specifies otherwise. 39 40 If the parents of a student share joint custody and time is evenly divided, the parents 41 may choose which of the two (2) school districts the student will enroll in for the 42 school year. 43 44 If the student is an emancipated minor, the resident school district shall be the one in 45 which the student is then living. 46

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1 Homeless students shall be enrolled immediately by the District in accordance with 2 current federal and state regulations and Policy 10140. 3 4 The Superintendent or his/her designee is empowered to develop administrative 5 procedures, in compliance with state requirements, which guarantee the right of every 6 school-age resident student and eligible nonresident student to attend the public 7 school. 8 9 A student's assigned school shall be the school located in his/her attendance area 10 unless special programs, services or facilities necessitate assignment to another 11 building. 12 13 Non-Resident Students 14 15 Non-resident students of school age who are living with and under the supervision of 16 a District resident shall be entitled to the same educational programs and services as 17 those enjoyed by resident students providing that authorization and an appropriate 18 agreement with the non-resident student's home district is in place. 19 20 The Superintendent, or his/her designee, shall require that appropriate legal documentation showing dependency or guardianship or a sworn statement of full 21 22 residential support be filed with the appropriate building Principal before an eligible 23 nonresident student may be accepted as a student in District schools. The 24 Superintendent, or his/her designee, may require a resident to submit additional, 25 reasonable information to substantiate a sworn statement, in accordance with 26 guidelines issued by the Department of Education. The Superintendent, or his/her 27 designee, reserves the right to verify claims of residency, dependency and guardianship and to remove from school attendance a nonresident student whose 28 29 claim is invalid. 30 31 If information contained in the sworn statement of residential support is found to be 32 false, the student shall be removed from school after notice is given of an opportunity 33 to appeal the student's removal. The District shall not be responsible for 34 transportation to or from school for any nonresident student residing outside District 35 boundaries. 36 37 Tuition rates shall be determined in accordance with statute. Tuition shall be charged 38 monthly, in advance of attendance. 39 40 Nonresident Children Placed In The District 41 42 Any child placed in the home of a District resident by a court or government agency 43 shall be admitted to District schools and shall receive the same benefits and be subject 44 to the same responsibilities as resident children. 45 46

4	where attendance is justified on the grounds that the student lives full-time and not			
5	just for the school year with District residents who have assumed legal dependency or			
6	guardianship or full residential support of the student.

8	The category of "non-resident students" includes school-aged students residing in			
9	foster homes or an institution or other facility within the District.			
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11	The Superintendent, or his/her designee, shall develop procedures for the enrollment

15	documentation by the parent/guardian.			
16	2. Verify claims of residency.			
17	3. Do not exclude any eligible student on the basis of race, creed, color, gender,			
18	sexual orientation, national origin, ancestry, or handicap/disability.			
19 20	4. Deny admission where the educational facilities or program maintained for			
20 21	District students is inadequate to meet the needs of the applicant.			
21 22	5. Make continued enrollment of any nonresident student contingent upon			
22	maintaining established standards of attendance, discipline and academics.Outline the appeal procedure relative to the removal of a student
