Course Description: AP U.S. History is a college-level course covering the gamut of American history, from discovery and exploration to the present day. As with all AP courses, the course offers students the opportunity to earn potential college credits. The AP U.S. History course is designed to provide students with the analytical skills and factual knowledge necessary to deal critically with the problems and materials in U.S. history. The program prepares students for intermediate and advanced college courses by making demands upon them that are equivalent to those made by full-year introductory college courses. Students learn to assess historical materials - their relevance to a given interpretive problem, reliability, and importance - and to weigh the evidence and interpretations presented in historical scholarship. AP U.S. History thus develops the skills necessary to arrive at conclusions on the basis of an informed judgment and to present reasons and evidence clearly and persuasively in essay format. It is recommended that students who enroll in AP U.S. History have attained a final average of at least 80 percent in U.S. History I College Preparatory. The course does have a comprehensive final examination.
