Course Title: American Government CP

Course Description: American Government is designed to provide students the background they need

to participate meaningfully in our democratic system. Student will examine the workings of all three levels of American Government – federal, state, and local – and how citizens get involved at each level. Units to studied include the basic foundations of government (including the U.S. Constitution), choosing government leaders, the separation of powers in government, and intergovernmental relations. Part of this course is to help students become active participants in our democratic system and how government will affect them the rest of their lives. A variety of media and activities will be used to achieve course objectives. College Preparatory (CP) American Government differs from American Government in that greater emphasis is placed on the skills required for success at the college level. Thus, CP students will do more supplemental readings (especially primary source documents) as well as more writing assignments and research. A final exam is required.
