<u>State</u>

Education Secretary Departs

PA Department of Education (PDE) Secretary Noe Ortega has submitted his resignation and the Governor has tapped a member of his staff to be interim secretary of the department. Ortega's resignation will be effective on April 29. The Governor praised Ortega for his service to PDE which began in 2017 when he was appointed Deputy Secretary of Higher Education and Commissioner for the Office of Postsecondary and Higher Education. "He led the department through unprecedented times, ensuring a safe return to in-person learning and providing access to COVID-19 testing and vaccines." Eric Hagarty who currently serves as deputy chief of staff for the Governor will be acting PDE secretary. Hagarty is a native of Seattle and graduate from the University of Washington in 2010. He came to Pennsylvania in 2011 serving in finance positions in Allegheny County. He has been in his current position with the Wolf Administration since March of 2016. To read more about Eric Haggarty <u>click here</u>. Deputy Secretary of Administration Hannah Barrick has also departed from PDE. She returned to the PA Association of School Business Officials earlier this month as executive director.

Another change coming at top of Department of Health. The state's acting Secretary of Health is heading for the door less than five months after taking the top spot at the agency. Gov. Tom Wolf said Monday that Keara Klinepeter's last day is Friday. He plans to name Physician General Dr. Denise Johnson to succeed her as acting health secretary. Klinepeter has been acting secretary since her predecessor, Alison Beam, left at the end of 2021. Beam had been on the job for less than a year. She replaced Dr. Rachel Levine who left to take the position of Assistant Secretary of Health in the federal Department of Health and Human Services.

Since its start in 2017, this State of Education annual report has served as a barometer of not only the key indicators of public school performance but also the timely challenges that public schools are facing and how they are coping with them. This year's report focuses

on the ongoing impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on public education in Pennsylvania and also includes data on parents' perception of public education. Hope you enjoy the report, which was just released today at: https://www.psba.org/2022/04/2022-state-of-education-report-released/ .

* <u>SB 934</u>: School Posting (on Third Consideration). The bill would require the posting of the preamble to the Pennsylvania Constitution in the entrance of every school building where state funding is provided to the district or institution of higher education.

* <u>SB 935</u>: School Posting (on Third Consideration). The bill would require the posting of the preamble to the United States Constitution in the entrance of every educational facility that accepts Commonwealth tax dollars.

* <u>SB 527</u>: Automatic EITC Increases (on Second Consideration). The bill amends the School Code to automatically increase the Educational Improvement Tax Credit (EITC) and Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit (OSTC) caps by 25% each fiscal year when at least 90% of the respective available tax credits are claimed in the previous Fiscal Year, effective in the 2022-23 school year.

* <u>HB 1660</u>: School Board Authority (on Third Consideration). The bill amends the School Code to curtail the authority of the school board concerning temporary emergency provisions. Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year and each school year thereafter, the bill would allow a school board of directors to put into operation temporary emergency provisions for 60 days when an emergency results in five consecutive days of being unable to provide in-person instruction. If an extension is necessary, after 60 days, the bill would require another two-thirds vote by the school board directors and a public hearing. The school board of directors have 60 days after the initial vote to implement their temporary emergency powers and must provide a written plan to the public with an explanation of why the temporary emergency provisions are necessary and how long they will be in effect. The term "emergency" means an event that prevents a school building from opening due to any of the following: (i) a communicable health issue or incident; (ii) a hazardous weather condition; (iii) a law enforcement emergency; (iv) the inoperability of school buses or other equipment necessary to the public school entity's operation; (v) damage to a school building; or (vi) another temporary circumstance rendering any portion of a school building unfit or unsafe for use. The bill does not impact a school entity's ability to utilize Flexible Instruction Days. The bill also makes some provisions for emergencies other than those for infectious diseases.

The Office of the Attorney General released a new report this week on student mental health from data and tips received through "Safe2Say Something PA," (Safe2Say) Pennsylvania's anonymous reporting system for schools, students and community members. The report is a compilation of new data from the Safe2Say program, additional state-level data, and national research on student mental health. It acknowledges the increased pressure young students face today that differs from previous generations, from youth gun violence to bullying and isolation on social media. Recent data strongly suggests that social isolation and difficulties accessing mental health services during the pandemic have had additional negative effects on the mental health of young people. The report says that what was once a new challenge facing families and parents has turned into a crisis with broad repercussions.

The report notes that "too many of Pennsylvania's children and teens' mental health needs are being underserved' and that "the commonwealth should establish sustained, broad support to place mental health counselors in every Pennsylvania school, with a focus on early intervention and preventive care." <u>Click here to read the report.</u>

Also this week, Rep. Ortitay (R-Allegheny) introduced <u>House Bill 2468</u>, legislation to help public schools address student mental health needs.

Attorney General Josh Shapiro released 'Safe2Say Something PA' special report on student mental health. 'Safe2Say Something PA' is Pennsylvania is anonymous reporting system for schools, students and community members. The program has received more than 80,000 tips from students across the Commonwealth since it launched in 2019. Of those total Safe2Say tips received, 72.9 percent have focused on instances of bullying, suicide and self-harm mental illness, or discrimination and harassment.
