Course Description: This course is the final level of a four-year program. This is an honors level course

with the possibility of earning college credits through a dual enrollment

opportunity. With a focus on literary analysis and interpretations, this curriculum covers English and multi-cultural novels and poetry, along with a variety of plays primarily from the thirteenth to twenty-first century. Students should expect extensive reading and writing assignments which will require utilizing time outside of the classroom. It is recommended that students have completed Honors 9, 10 and 11 as prerequisites to this course. The course will examine the ways in which meaning is created in both fiction and non-fiction texts and introduce students to the methods of literary interpretations. Students will articulate literary analyses in the form of writing, discussion and formal presentations. Utilizing literary concepts, students will consider the interaction between the reader, the writer and the text itself as they examine literature through a variety of lenses. Students

will become active readers through annotation, critical analysis, thorough discussion and reflection. District marking period assessments are required.
