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Preface

Thomas & Williamson was engaged by Warren County School District in February 2017 to perform this assessment of the regional job market and provide an analysis of how the Warren County Career Center (WCCC) can adapt to meet the demands of that market. This assessment consists of three parts: 1.) An analysis of available statistics from various sources, 2.) Results of a series of online surveys administered by Thomas & Williamson during the month of May 2017, and 3.) Conclusions to the correlation of our research and the survey results.

Thomas & Williamson has been involved with assisting Warren County School District in developing a plan for improvements to WCCC since 2015. Thomas & Williamson was hired by the District in 2015 to provide a study for a future renovation project at WCCC. A detailed review and cataloging of the 13 programs offered at the time was performed including recommendations for improvements to be made. Renovation and expansion options to the facility were conceptualized and cost estimates generated. Attention was also given to the program requirements for the future, at the time, Health/Medical Assisting program. The Health/Medical Assistance program was implemented at WCCC for the 2015-2016 school year. In 2016, Thomas & Williamson completed an addendum to the study as the District considered the inclusion of district-wide programming into WCCC.

Warren County School District commissioned this assessment to build upon the information Thomas & Williamson compiled in 2015 and 2016 in order to aid in making the best decisions possible for the future of WCCC. With the identification of key industries of employment growth, especially in the region, the District can take a proactive approach in shaping the current programs to meet employment demand and potentially adding programs that can be a mutual benefit to students and surrounding industries in search of qualified jobseekers.

While the main focus is on academic programming, a plan for construction is also under consideration. A reconfiguration of spaces, expansion of existing labs and the construction of flexible generic lab spaces is being considered. With an added focus on the real world outside of the campus, the District is able to better prepare students in obtaining a rewarding career right outside of high school or pursing post-secondary education to achieve their goals.

The following assessment will provide our analysis of available statistical data and survey responses in which solidify the statement that Health Care & Social Services, Manufacturing and Retail Services are the leading industries of employment of today and into the future for the region.



Nationwide Statistics

Throughout the United States, including Warren County, there have been major shifts in the job market within the last 125 years. No shift is more dramatic than the one in the manufacturing and mining industries which has had a major impact not only on the country, but on Pennsylvania as well. Today we are seeing shifts move from manufacturing towards the service and healthcare industries. Within the last 50 years, the top occupations have required less physical skills and more social and analytical skills. This change has helped fuel the increase in furthering education in pursuit of a job. Many jobs that provide a living wage require post-secondary education with either certifications, college degrees or both. As we take a look at the job market as it stands today within Warren County, and similarly to the rest of the county, the bulk of the workforce is employed in the industries of healthcare, education, manufacturing, retail trade and services.

Before analyzing the data that is available, it is important to note the differences in classifications or groupings used by various governmental agencies.



Manufacturing vs. Other Industries

When discussing the modern job market history of the United States, the manufacturing industry is a key topic, as it was once the leader in employment. From the industrial revolution and onwards, the United States rose to become the top manufacturing country in the world up until the year 2010. In the 1940's, a leap in manufacturing was fueled by World War II, pro-labor policies and limited global competition. As a result, the manufacturing industry accounted for a third of the total non-farm employment during the 1940's decade. The total share of people employed in manufacturing compared to the total number of non-farm employees reached an all-time high of 38.8% in November of 1943. As of May 2017, employees within the manufacturing industry account for only 8.5% of the total number of non-farm employees, a record low.


The graph below, generated using the FRED online service of Federal Reserve Bank of St. Louis, shows the relation of the number of employees in manufacturing in comparison to service-providing industries and overall non-farm employment. The timeline graphed is from January 1939, when the Department of Labor started keeping records, to May 2017. Vertical bars in grey refer to historic recessions. You'll notice that as the total number of people employed in the service-providing industries continued to climb, manufacturing numbers remained steady, even seeing small growth in the 70's, while continually losing share of the job market.






Another way to visualize the shift in the job market, is to look at the change in the industries with the highest employment by state level. In 2014, the Department of Labor published a series of maps showing the comparison of highest employment by industry from 1990 to 2013. Even in 1990, manufacturing was still the ruler of employment for the majority of the continental states. By 2013, health care and social assistance became the industry with highest employment for the majority of the continental states.

Major industries with highest employment, by state 2013




Statewide & Regional Statistics

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has seen its fair share in the change of the economy and its effect on employment within the last 50 years. Today, as in line with the majority of the country, the industry of health care and social assistance has become the leading industry of employment, at 18% as of the third quarter of 2016. While manufacturing has experienced a decline, the industry is in third place in overall industry share of the state's employment, at 10% as of the third quarter of 2016. At the bottom of the list ranking the 20 major industries, the "Mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction" industry accounts for only a fraction of a percent of the total employment. The graph below illustrates the top 5 industries by employment (1. Health Care and Social Assistance, 2. Retail Trade, 3. Manufacturing, 4. Accommodation and Food Services, and 5. Educational Services) compared to that of the lowest industry.

High Priority Occupations

While 10 year projections can be helpful in determining the occupations with future job growth, the Center for Workforce Information & Analysis (CWIA), a bureau under the PA Department of Labor & Industry, provides another analysis that forecasts in demand occupations in the coming year ahead. Every year the CWIA releases a list of the top job categories in demand by employers, called High Priority Occupations (HPOs). This list is used to target the state's public investments in education and training to ensure that those investments are being used for the occupations at the forefront of employer demand. All of the occupations on the list require some form of training/education with some requiring beyond a four-year college degree. The list is developed by the commonwealth's workforce development strategists using occupational data, expert input and regional factors. As such, the lists are broken down by workforce development areas, 22 lists for 23 areas (City of Pittsburgh & Allegheny County are combined). Warren County is included with the Northwest Workforce Development Area which includes also consists of Erie, Clarion, Crawford, Forest and Venango.

The 2016 HPOs list for the Northwest Area, which is valid from September 1, 2016, through August 31, 2017, lists a total of 127 occupations. While the list does not specifically rank the occupations by highest priority, they do list relevant data include wages and projected employment for the year 2022. The following observations were made:

- The top 5 occupations based on projected annual openings, in ascending order, is Registered Nurses, Office Clerks, Customer Service Representatives and Nursing Assistants.
- 2. When you group the occupations by major group category per the Standard Occupation Classification system, used by Federal statistical agencies to classify workers, the Healthcare Practitioners and Technical Occupations category contains the most occupations on the list. Following this category, the remaining top 4 include: Office and Administrative Support, Production, Construction & Extraction, and Installation, Maintenance, & Repair Occupations.
- 3. A total of 81 of the 127 occupations, or 64% of the total, require educational attainment other than a college degree including high school diploma with the following: short term or long term on-the-job training or apprenticeship of up to a year, related work experience or postsecondary training. This statistic reveals bright future for those students graduating for a career/technical school who wish to pursue a career directly out of school or in the near future following graduation.
- 4. Of the 81 occupations, the entry level wage, based on 2015 numbers, ranges from \$16,970 for Fitness Trainers & Aerobic Instructors to \$62,680 for Electrical Power-Line Installers Repairers.

Educational Attainment Abbreviations:

Short-term or Moderate-term training (ST OJT or MT OJT) - basic tasks and skills are learned through a period of on-the-job training. A high school diploma may be required.

Long-term training (LT OJT) - a high school diploma and at least one year of on-the-job training or an apprenticeship.

Related work experience (WK EXP) - a high school diploma and training gained through hands-on work in a similar occupation.

Postsecondary training (PS or PS+) - training is gained through a postsecondary training program. Some period of related work experience may be required.

Associate Degree (AD or AD+) – degree completed after two years of full-time schooling beyond high school. Some period of related work experience may be required.

Bachelor's Degree (BD or BD+) - degree completed after four years of full-time schooling beyond high school. Some period of related work experience may be required.

Master's Degree (MD or MD+) – degree completed after two years of full-time schooling beyond a bachelor's degree. Some period of related work experience may be required.

Doctoral (PhD) or First Professional Degree (PROF) – degree programs requiring 3-6 years of education at the college or university level beyond a four-year bachelor's degree.

Top Job Skills

Beyond the data regarding high priority occupations and projected industries of growth, what skills are currently in demand? Searching through occupation titles does not always give one the whole picture, not until you read the details and requirements can you assess whether you're qualified for the job. Every two years, the CWIA releases a Job Skills Report which lists and assesses job skills that employers have listed as "required" or "desired" specific to their sort of work and in job postings. To generate this report, the CWIA utilizes their Occupational Employment Projections as well as the U.S. Department of Labor's Occupational Information Network (O*NET) database. The report breaks down the job skills into the following four (4) categorical lists:

- 1. Knowledge Area a key educational or experience requirement for an occupation (e.g. Computers and Electronics).
- 2. General Work Activities types of job behaviors that occur across multiple occupations (e.g. interacting with computers).
- Detailed Work Activities types of specific job behaviors or duties particular to an occupation (e.g. use computers to enter, access or retrieve data).
- 4. Tools & Technologies machines, equipment, tools, and information technologies that one could be expected to use in a particular occupation (e.g. power grinders).

The latest report available utilizes data and projections based on the year 2014 data. As with the High Priority Occupations list, a report is generated for each workforce development area. In a review of the data available for the Northwest area, we have sorted each of the four lists by two ways: 1.) by total annual openings and 2.) by change in employment from 2014 to 2024. We also sorted both lists prioritizing "hot skills" above all others, which are skills identified by CWIA that have increased ranking since the last report released and/or in employment projections.

In singling out the top skills in each of the four lists, in two different ways, we were able to observe the following:

- 1. Knowledge
 - Close to half of the skills listed in either column cover a broad range of occupations and industries. These skills include "English Language", "Mathematics", "Computers & Electronics", and "Clerical".
 - b. "Customer & Personal Service" (e.g. health care professionals, sales representatives, etc.), "Administration & Management", and "Education & Training" align with the occupations listed as high priority or HPOs and top industries by employment.
- 2. General Work Activity
 - a. The majority of the skills listed in either column cover a broad range of occupations and industries.
 - b. "Assisting & Caring for Others" changes ranking from 10th to 3rd place when sorting by the largest jump in projected employment in 2024. This skill is geared towards a more specific industry, like Healthcare & Social Assistance, more so than the other skills in this ranking. "Assisting & Caring for Others" can be contributed to the aging population in the area and the ever-growing need for personal care.
- 3. Detailed Work Activity
 - a. Healthcare related skills fill the entire top 10 when sorted by projected employment in 2024. This data solidifies the fact that the healthcare industry is at the top in Warren County and the surrounding region.
 - b. In review of the complete data file, approximately 48% or 108 out of the 226 "hot skills" are related to the healthcare industry and healthcare occupations.
- 4. Tools & Technology
 - When sorting these skills by annual job openings, the skills mostly relate to Construction, Manufacturing and Retail Services ("Bar Code Reader Equipment") industries.
 - b. By far, the most interesting observation when sorting these skills by the largest jump in projected employment in 2024, 8 out of the top 10 refer to the Healthcare & Social Assistance industry. These skills align with the occupations listed as high priority or HPOs.
 - c. An outlying skill with no association to the others that ranked in 10th place when ranking by projected employment in 2024 was "Facilities Management Software". Per O*NET, facilities management software consists of computerized maintenance management system (CMMS) software. Some occupations that utilize this skill or some form thereof, listed per O*NET, includes industrial production managers, fuel production managers, elevator repairers, building maintenance workers, machinists and refuse material collectors.

Through the hundreds of skills listed in the data files, sifting through ones that don't have any merit such as "distinguishing colors", there are skills listed that WCCC currently hones in on, others that can be added to an instructor's curriculum or others which could be covered in an entirely new program offering.



Countywide & Local Statistics

If you take a look at the history of the economy in Warren County and the surrounding region, you will realize that there have been both gradual and huge shifts in the job market. In the early 1800's, Warren saw a booming forestry and timber industry. With an abundant hardwood forest, loggers were able to utilize the waterways of the Allegheny River, as well as for the Conewango, Brokenstraw and Kinzua Creeks for the transportation of timber. Farming rose as there was more and more cleared land available following the boom. In 1875, the economy and job market took a pivotal shift within Warren County with the discovery of oil in the area. By this time, oil was already a booming industry in Northern Pennsylvania. A former driller named David Beaty, whom moved to Warren along Conewango Creek, struck oil in search of natural gas to use for his mansion. This find led to the Bradford oil field, which supplied a majority of the world's oil in the 1880's, and the Warren Oil Exchange in 1882. While employment data is not available, it is understood that the oil boom created many jobs for drillers, equipment operators, laborers and transportation. By 1901, the oil boom ended in Pennsylvania as the Standard Oil Company emerged and oil was found elsewhere in Ohio, Texas and North Dakota. While there are jobs in the oil & gas industry of Warren County, it is likely in never will reach the percentage of employment in the industry as it was back in the 1800's.

Fast forward to modern times of Today, traces of the oil market are still prevalent. This includes companies like United Refining Company, Crossett Inc., West Penn Oil Company Inc., and Pennsylvania General Energy Company. These companies are part of the Top 50 Employers for Warren County for the 2nd Quarter of 2016, per PA Center for Workforce Information & Analysis.

Below is a list of the top ten companies and industries of Warren County during the 2nd quarter of 2016. The industries are categorizes using the NAICS coding system. The service industry, retail trade and manufacturing are prominent among all other industries.

Warren County Top Companies & Industries – 2nd Quarter of 2016



Healthcare industry

The Healthcare industry has and continues to play a large part in the economy and employment in Warren, PA. The county is home to two major hospitals (Warren General Hospital and Warren State Hospital) as well as a VA outpatient clinic (Warren County Community Based Outpatient Clinic, part of the Erie VA Medical Center) and numerous other establishments. In 1880, the Warren State Hospital, formerly The State Hospital for the Insane, accepted its first patient. From there on, the hospital reached a patient count of approximately 2,600 by 1963. Today, the hospital has the capacity for 225 patients. Beyond Warren County, the hospital continues to serve the counties of Cameron, Clarion, Clearfield, Crawford, Elk, Erie, Forest, Jefferson, McKean, Mercer, Potter, and Venango. As a result of the history and continuing presence of the healthcare industry in Warren, it is understandable that the healthcare industry is at the top of the charts, as well as occupations and related occupational skills.

Another driver of the leading industry of healthcare is the demographics of Warren County. Per the 2015 estimated population numbers by the U.S. Census, over 20% of Warren's population is 65 years or older, compared to only 16% for Pennsylvania and 14% for the entire country.

 - "Feed patients"

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

Online Survey Overview

During the month of May 2017, Thomas & Williamson administered a series of three (3) online surveys hosted by the online service SurveyMonkey.com. The surveys targeted three distinct groups: prospective students from Warren County School District, graduates of WCCC, and businesses throughout Warren County. Each of the three surveys were developed specifically for their targeted groups with unique questions. A majority of the survey questions were multiple choice with only a few where the participant could type an answer. The survey questions were independently developed by Thomas & Williamson and approved by District administrators for release. Each survey was designed to target people that had an interest in WCCC or any other career/vocational school. For example, the prospective student survey would end after question number 2 if the participant was not planning to enroll at WCCC. The surveys were set up using "branch logic" which has the participant skip to another section of the survey dependent on the answer.

Due to the way the survey was set up, it is important to view each question's results independently. You will notice that some questions within a survey have more responses than others. This is due to branch logic, whether an answer was required, and/or whether a participant decided to abruptly exit the survey partway through. If a participant exited a survey partway through, the responses were retained for the questions that were answered.



Survey Responses

The number of responses between the three groups varied greatly as seen from the chart above. Interestingly enough, the two surveys with the most responses came from two dramatically different groups – the prospective students with 654 responses and the businesses with 46 responses. The graduate survey only received a total of 3 responses out of 434.

- Prospective Students
 - o 5/17/2017 to 5/31/17
 - o 654 responses from 8th Grade, 9th Grade, & 10th Grade
 - Up to 14 possible questions to answer
 - Administered by the District to students during school.



- Graduates
 - o 5/16/17 to 5/28/17
 - o 3 responses from graduates of years 2013, 2015, & 2016
 - Up to 22 possible questions to answer (Complete survey list included 23 questions)
 - Postcards with a link to the online survey were mailed to a total 434 graduates from years 2013 to 2016. Postcards started to arrive in the mail on 5/16/17 and participants were given a deadline of 5/28/17.
- Businesses
 - o 5/5/17 to 5/19/17
 - o 46 responses
 - Up to 33 possible questions to answer (Complete survey list included 34 questions)
 - A link to the survey was emailed by The Warren County Chamber of Business & Industry to approximately 400 business contacts within Warren County on 5/5/17.

The following list includes a selection of the most insightful and helpful feedback received from the responses.

- Of the current programs offered at WCCC, 25% of prospective students would consider Healthcare their first choice.
- In a list of programs offered at other northwestern PA career/votech schools, prospective students are most interested in Child Care, Diesel Tech, and Cosmetology.
- Graduates responded that Automotive Tech, Auto Collision and Machine Tech are the most beneficial for the job market.
- Businesses feel that the programs of Business Accounting, Food Production, Healthcare, Machine Tech and Welding are most beneficial for the job market.
- Out of graduates businesses have hired, they would like to see more hands-on experience and more training with tools/equipment.
- 92% of businesses that responded would consider hiring a graduate from WCCC or other career/votech school.

A full survey results report was generated for each of the three surveys. Each report includes the number of responses and answers to each question as well as the participant commentary. The reports can be found in the Appendices of this assessment.



Conclusion

In taking a look at the entire spread of data presented in this assessment, one will see common themes and themes that are not so common between the statistics and the survey results. Healthcare is one of those common themes. Between the employment statistics, industry statistics, employment projects and survey data, the healthcare industry trumps all others. Interestingly, PDE has availability of nine program offerings within their "Health Sciences" career grouping. WCCC currently offers one of these nine programs, "Health/Medical Assisting Services", first offered at the beginning of the 2015-2016 school year. There are seven remaining programs available once you factor out the "Veterinary Health" program. These seven programs include the following:

- 1. Dental Assisting/Assistant
- 2. Emergency Medical Technology/Technician (EMT Paramedic)
- 3. Health Care Technology
- 4. Health Information/Medical Records Technology/Technician
- 5. Medical/Clinical Assistant
- 6. Nurse/Nursing Assistant/Aide And Patient Care Assistant
- 7. Rehabilitation Aide

Based on this data, the District may consider the following two options out of many others:

- A. Expand the available student capacity of the current "Health/Medical Assisting Services" program. This may require expanding the footprint of the current floor area devoted to the program as well as additional equipment and instructional staff. As a result, construction costs, operational costs and staffing costs would need to be considered if this option was implemented.
- B. Add one or more of the seven available programs under PDE for "Health Sciences". This will require additional instructional space as well as possible additional lab space not available in the current facility. As a result, construction costs related to an addition, operational costs and staffing costs would need to be considered if this option was implemented.

Another major employer of the region includes manufacturing. WCCC currently offers a program that is geared towards this industry: Machine Tool Technology/Machinist. One of the questions from the survey asked what skills graduates and/or schools need to place greater emphasis on. Out of 18 responses, 50% of the participants called for "more hands-on experience, experiments, or projects". If this data says anything, it should give a push to the need for more experience with the equipment within the program.

Beyond the industries of healthcare and manufacturing, the retail trade industry (food stores, apparel & accessory stores, eating & drinking places, etc.) as well as the other facets of the service industry besides healthcare (automotive, financial, legal, education, hotels & lodging, etc.) are also major employers within the region. Within WCCC's 14 programs currently offered, one is able to find training related to each of these two industries.



If the District focuses on the common theme of all the data presented, data points towards healthcare. If the District focuses on the student interest of programs not provided by WCCC, the students would like to see the additions of Child Care, Diesel Tech, and Cosmetology. If the District focuses on the interests of the regional businesses, the survey data points to a push for Healthcare, Business/Accounting, Welding, Food Production, Computer Maintenance, and Machine Technology. Since WCCC has voluntary enrollment, does it not make sense to appeal to student interest in order to sustain enrollment? Based on what the data tells us and in the pursuit of what is best for the students, does it make sense for the District to ignore the survey data? These are the questions that the District will need to contemplate in finding a common ground between all of the unique groups of people that WCCC effects.




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
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


Q2 How likely are you to enroll in a course at WCCC?




Q5 What career cluster do you believe would most benefit you in finding a job in Warren County or the surrounding region? (Select up to 3)




Q24 Are you currently trying to expand or grow your business?


Q25 Are you currently hiring new employees or planning to in the near future?









Q28 Where are you most likely to advertise






