When must a district file a non-reimbursable application?

Second, third and fourth class districts must file an application for any construction or reconstruction, and for ordinary repairs or maintenance work of a value greater than \$15,000. The application must be submitted and receive Departmental approval before the district enters into contract for the planned work.

Which non-reimbursable application should be used?

Use PDE-3074(a) for non-reimbursable work where the estimated cost is greater than \$10,000 and as such is subject to the legal requirements for advertising and bidding. Use PDE 3074(b) for non-reimbursable work which is estimated to cost between \$4,000-\$10,000 or for an emergency where the estimated cost is greater than \$10,000, and as such is exempt from advertising requirements, but still subject to bidding requirements. Use PDE-3074(c) for non-reimbursable work that is exempt from both advertising and bidding requirements, such as work peld for with funds from booster clubs, work contracted and directly funded by an insurance company, or the leasing of relocatable classrooms.

When must a district advertise and bid a project?

See Action Required for Various Non-Reimbursable Projects in the <u>General Instructions</u> (PDF - requires <u>Acrobat Reader</u>) for Non-Reimbursable Projects.

What other paperwork must be submitted with a non-reimbursable application?

Only the one-page self-certification application needs to be submitted to the Department. Any plans and specifications should be retained at the district.

What is the purpose of filing a non-reimbursable application?

By law, second, third and fourth class districts must receive Department of Education approval of plans and specifications for all public school construction or reconstruction, and for ordinary repairs or maintenance work of a value greater than \$15,000. The self-certification application process enables a district to comply with this legal requirement.

What is an emergency?

An emergency occurs when a school plant or any part thereof is unusable primarily as a result of a recent fire, flood, storm, or unforeseen mechanical or structural failure. Examples of justified emergencies: the roof blowing off during high wind conditions; citations by an agency, where the health and safety of occupants is critical, with or without a deadline to complete the work, i.e. fire alarm system, emergency generator, mold or fungal contamination.

Can a district use just one contractor to complete the work stemming from an emergency?

Based on the advice of our legal office, separate prime contracts are <u>not</u> required when specifying work stemming from an amergency. This means that in the case of an emergency, bids may be solkited from three prime or general contractors to complete all of the work necessary to restore a school facility to its priginal condition.

Does Act 34 of 1973 apply to non-reimbursable projects?

Act 34 of 1973, also known as the Taj Mahai Act, requires a public hearing prior to the construction of a new building or substantial addition whether the protect is reimbursable or not. A building addition is considered "substantial" when its planned architectural area divided by the existing structure's architectural area is greater than 20%. The Act requires a second Act 34 hearing if bid costs exceed by eight percent or more the estimated costs presented at the first hearing. The Act further requires a referendum if certain costs for a new building or substantial addition exceed the calculated referendum limit for that project. Again, the requirements of Act 34 apply whether or not a project receives school construction funding from the Commonwealth.
