## 5500 FOOD SERVICES

## 5505 FURNISHING FOOD TO SCHOOL CHILDREN

 No student enrolled will be deprived of participation in established lunch and/or milk programs of the District because of financial limitation. Guidelines for free and reduced lunches and/or free milk shall be those currently approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. Application for free or reduced price meals may be made by the parent or guardian to the building principal. The anonymity of recipients of free or reduced price meals shall be preserved to the greatest degree possible.

The Board recognizes that students require adequate, nourishing food and beverages in order to grow, learn and maintain good health and directs that students shall be provided with adequate space and time to eat meals during the school day. The Superintendent or his/her designee is authorized to develop and disseminate administrative procedures to implement this policy.

The District shall ensure, in the operation of the food service program, no student, staff member, or other individual shall be discriminated against on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, sex or disability

The food service program and the procurement of goods or services for the food service program shall be operated in compliance with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations, as well as, federal guidelines established by the Child Nutrition Division of the United States Department of Agriculture. The price charged to students shall be established annually by the District in compliance with state and federal laws.

Non-program food shall be priced to generate sufficient revenues to cover the cost of such items. A non-program food shall be defined as a food or beverage, other than a reimbursable meal or snack, that is sold at the school and is purchased using funds from the child nutrition account. Non-program foods include but are not limited to adult meals and a-la-carte items. All revenue from the sale of non-program food shall accrue to the child nutrition program account.

The operation and supervision of the food service program shall be the responsibility of the Superintendent or his/her designee, who shall ensure school meals meet the standards required by the School Breakfast Program, the National School Lunch Program and the Special Milk Program. Cafeterias shall be operated on a nonprofit basis, and a periodic review of the cafeteria accounts shall be made by the Superintendent or his/her designee.

1 The Superintendent or designee shall annually notify students, parents/guardians and 2 employees concerning the contents of this policy and applicable administrative 3 procedures. Notification shall include information related to nondiscrimination. 4 5 The District shall use USDA Foods for school menus available under the Child 6 **Nutrition USDA Foods Programs.** 7 8 The District shall provide free and reduced-price meals and/or free milk to students in 9 accordance with the terms and conditions of the National School Lunch Program, the 10 School Breakfast Program and the Special Milk Program. The anonymity of recipients of free or reduced-price meals and/or free milk shall be preserved as required by law. 11 12 13 The District shall make appropriate food service and/or meal accommodations to 14 students with special dietary needs in accordance with applicable law, regulations and 15 Board policy. 16 17 The District shall obtain two safety inspections per year in accordance with local, state, 18 and federal laws and regulations. The District shall post the most recent inspection 19 report and release a copy of the report to members of the public upon request. 20 21 The District shall comply with federal requirements in developing a food safety 22 program that enables District schools to take systematic action to prevent or minimize 23 the risk of foodborne illness among students. The District shall maintain proper 24 sanitation and health standards in food storage, preparation and service, in accordance 25 with applicable state and local laws and regulations and federal food safety 26 requirements. 27 28 The District shall comply with the professional standards for school food service 29 personnel who manage and operate the National School Lunch and School Breakfast 30 Programs.
